Toxic Air Pollution Requested for DEQ Approval	2,148,660 pounds/year	No data	<p>This type of air pollution triggers chronic health risks for people living nearby.</p> <p>The pollution would increase racially disproportionate pollution burdens for predominantly African American and Vietnamese American neighborhoods.</p>
Carbon Pollution & Other Greenhouse Gases Requested for DEQ Approval	1.3 billion pounds/year	No data	<p>This type of air pollution warms our planet and contributes to the climate change effects of sea level rise, stronger hurricanes, floods, and other extreme weather.</p>
Number of Startup and Shutdowns Requested for DEQ Approval	500 times/year	No data	<p>Creates pollution spikes that can increase the harmful effects of exposure.</p>
Amount of Proposed Groundwater Use	1.1 million gallons/daily	No data	<p>Entergy's groundwater use during Michoud facility operation linked to accelerated land sinking, impaired levee, and flood risk, according to a March 2016 report by NASA.</p>
Construction Cost	\$232 Million	\$210 Million	<p>This would increase electric bills for New Orleans customers.</p> <p>Not likely to be offset by potential sales to MISO market as electric supply is greater than demand.</p>
Profit (Return on Equity at least 11% of construction cost)	\$25.5 Million	\$23.1 Million	<p>This would be added to electric bills for New Orleans customers.</p> <p>How do we ensure that Entergy's interest in a new power plant serves the public interest, not profit motive?</p>
