AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Ordinance No. 27258 MCS, which established
the Council's Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC), to clarify the appropriate advisory
scope, the Council Committees whereby EAC's recommendations or advice are reported, to
modify appointment procedures; and to provide otherwise with respect thereto.
SECTION 1. THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW ORLEANS HEREBY
ORDAINS, That Ordinance No. 27258 MCS is hereby amended and reordained to read as
follows:
"SECTION 1. THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW ORLEANS HEREBY
ORDAINS, That an advisory committee, to be known as the Environmental Advisory
Committee ("EAC"), is hereby established to provide advice, feedback, and subject matter
expertise to the Council with respect to environment and sustainability, relative to these specific

SECTION 2. That the Advisory Committee shall consist of eleven (11) members, one to be appointed by each Councilmember, one ex-officio member from the Office of Neighborhood 11 12 Engagement, one ex-officio member from City Park, one representative of the Department of Sanitation, and one representative of the Office of Resilience and Sustainability, all of which are 13

areas: living with water, green infrastructure, transportation, and economic incentives for

- subject to the approval of the full Council. Every effort shall be made to ensure that members possess expertise or experience in the following general areas:
- stormwater management;
- o green infrastructure;
- transportation;

- renewable energy; and
- economic incentives relative to these areas.
 - SECTION 3. Each Advisory Committee member shall serve a one year term. This Advisory Committee may be reappointed by City Council motion after the one year term, if desired. If vacancies in the membership of the Advisory Committee arise during the year, they may be filled by the Council for the remainder of the term. The Advisory Committee shall elect a chair from among its members. The Advisory Committee chair shall hold meetings regularly, but no less frequently than once quarterly, and at hours as may be fixed by the committee. All such meetings shall be subject to the provisions of the Louisiana Open Meeting Laws. Special meetings may be held on call of the chair upon 48 hours' notice to the members of the Advisory Committee. A copy of the minutes of all meetings shall be sent to the following Council Committees, along with any recommendations or advice:
- 1) Utility, Cable, Telecommunications and Technology Committee;
- 32 2) Transportation and Airport Committee;
- 3) Smart & Sustainable Cities Committee; and
- 34 4) Public Works, Sanitation and Environment Committee.
- 35 **SECTION 4.** The Advisory Committee shall have no legislative powers of its own but shall be an advisory body of the Council of the City of New Orleans concerning the matters with

37	which it is charged, and the aforementioned Committees of the Council will receive and consider
38	the Advisory Committee's recommendations on such matters, and if desired, send appropriate
39	advice to the full City Council for consideration."
