Louisiana Green Corps Statement in Support of Together New Orleans (TNO) Position on the Advisors' Report

Louisiana Green Corps respectfully joins Together New Orleans (TNO) and the Alliance for Affordable Energy (AAE) in expressing concern that the Advisors' recent report does not go far enough to meet our community's urgent resilience needs. While we appreciate the effort to provide a thoughtful and measured assessment, we believe the current recommendations miss important opportunities to deliver timely, equitable, and cost-effective solutions for New Orleans residents.

Our city is fortunate to have access to the State Energy Resilience Initiative (SERI) funds — a rare and powerful resource that could help launch community-based projects to strengthen our grid, safeguard vulnerable residents during extreme weather, and reduce energy costs. We are concerned that the report's decision to set aside these funds, coupled with its lack of a clear plan for affordability and enforceable timelines, could result in delays that put both lives and resources at risk.

Louisiana Green Corps believes that resilience planning should be guided by a few essential principles: independence in administration, affordability for all residents in a way that drives equity, transparency, and a sense of urgency. We believe the current report, while well-intentioned, does not yet meet these standards and may reinforce processes that are too slow to respond to the challenges our city faces.

We encourage the City Council to build on the Advisors' work by adopting a framework that uses all available resources — including the SERI funds — to act quickly, inclusively, and with a long-term vision for equity. New Orleans has a unique chance to create a stronger, fairer energy future, and with the right steps, we can seize this opportunity to protect lives, strengthen our infrastructure, and ensure benefits are shared widely across our community.
