ORDER

Pursuant to Council Resolution R-23-74, Together New Orleans (“TNO”) was directed to file by April 17, 2023:

(a) a list of the specific resilience hubs in Orleans Parish that it proposes to construct for grid resilience which specifically identifies what, if any, support or assistance is needed from ENO including to successfully interconnect its proposed resilience hubs to ENO's electric system, and (b) a reasonable estimate of the costs associated with the support and/or assistance required, if any, as well as the total estimated costs for the project and proposed cost recovery mechanism(s).

Resolution at p.10, Ordering Paragraph 2.

However, on April 18, 2023, TNO filed a pleading (“motion”) entitled “a request for leniency,” which indicated that it “experienced an unexpected technical issue with exporting a benefit-cost analysis that is an important component to TNO’s filing,” and requested “leniency in the receipt of a tardy filing.” Motion at 1. One week later, the required filing was indeed filed on April 24, 2023.

If any party objects to the late filing, said party may file a written objection by April 28, 2023. If *no* timely objection is filed, TNO's filing of April 24, 2023, shall be accepted into the evidentiary record.
